### **Syllabus of Paediatrics**

Common childhood Emergencies, National programmes related to child Health, Basic Newborn Care, Accidents and poisonings in children, Normal Developmental Milestone, Recognizing children with special needs and management, Birth Defects and counselling, Immunity in children.

### **Syllabus of Surgery**

Urological surgery, Neurosurgery Anaesthesiology, Orthopaedic Surgery, General Surgery, (Wounds, Infections, Tumours, blood vessels, .Breast, Head and neck, .Liver, bile, pancreas, Spleen, .Abdominal wall and injuries, Sinuses/Cysts, Alimentary Tract), Otorhinolaryngology ENT, Diagnosis and management of common surgical ailments, Wound Healing, Preoperative care of Surgical Patients, Shock patho-physiology and management, Thoracic Surgery, Ophthalmology, Medicolegal and ethical issues of surgery, And other subtopics.
